It is the intention of Appomattox County to use funding provided from the direct distributions to create a locally driven ad campaign promoting opioid awareness centered around the idea of "Keep Them Safe." The primary goal of this campaign will be to promote prescription safety and raise awareness of the importance of reducing the risk of substance use by locking prescriptions away. There will be intentional targeting of populations by location within the county and specifically identified demographics. This campaign will be a digital and televised campaign that will then encourage viewers to visit the county's website where we will have local resources listed as well as opioid abuse information and treatment availability for the community.

		It is the intention of Appomattox County to purchase and provide free lock boxes for citizens of Appomattox County in need of such devices. We intend to purchase two (2) sizes and possibly different types of lock boxes as demand warrants. Citizen will have the ability to complete an on-line form requesting the free lock box or they may stop by the County Administration Office during normal pusiness hours. It is also intended that the County will provide these resources to community partners, such as the Appomattox County Sheriff's Office and the Appomattox County Department of Social Services, to promote safety within the greater Appomattox community. Appomattox County will be creating and producing printed information pamphlets to promote the lock box program and to raise awareness of the dangers of opioid misuse.

f.	Describe the objectives of this project
	It is the objective of Appomattox County to reduce opioid availability to the general population while increasing awareness of the dangers of opioids. In addition, it is the objective of the county to provide knowledge and resources around the general ideas of substance use and safety.
g.	How was the need determined and how does that need relate to abatement?
	The need was determined by conducting interviews with local law enforcement and social workers to better understand the trends of Substance Use and Substance Availability in Appomattox County. During that process it was clear that the general population does not have the information needed, nor the resources to promote drug safety, especially around prescription medications. The lock box program will provide an increased understanding around this need in tandem with the ad campaign that will be funded through the Direct Distribution. Additionally, the lock box program and information pamphlet will provide direct resources to community members to aid in keeping prescription drugs safe from others.

	Appomattox County, with a population of 16,119 (2020 US Census), and a budget of \$52 Million, is located within the Central Virginia Planning District Commission region. Appomattox County is rural in nature with economic ties to the City of Lynchburg, Virginia. A majority of citizens commute to the Lynchburg area on a daily basis for employment, entertainment, and recreational opportunities. Appomattox County, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia, will be fully responsible for overseeing the budget, including maintaining and reporting as needed. Appomattox County will also be fully responsible for purchasing and distributing purchased materials throughout the county.
i.	Who are the targeted beneficiaries, and how many persons are expected to participate per year?
	Appomattox County intends the targeted beneficiaries to be citizens of Appomattox County who have prescription medications, specifically opioids, that need to be secured to reduce the misuse of these prescriptions. Appomattox County will purchase and distribute 100 boxes this year. Additionally Appomattox County will have printed 5,000 information pamphlets that will be distributed throughout the county by the local pharmacies.

	According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Appomattox Counties opioid dispensing rate as of 2020 was 16.977 (per 100 persons). Historically, as of 2015 the opioid dispensing rate for Appomattox County was 138.6 (per 100 persons). With this knowledge we know that almost 17% of the population was receiving opioid prescriptions in 2020 which is the most recent data available at this time.

A RESOLUTION Providing Signatory Authority in Relation to Proposed Grant Funding From the Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority

WHEREAS, the Appomattox County Board of Supervisors seeks to mitigate and abate the impacts of the opioid epidemic in Appomattox County; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority (OAA) is to abate and remediate the opioid epidemic in the Commonwealth through financial support in the form of grants, donations, or other assistance; and

WHEREAS, the OAA has invited each city and county in Virginia to submit proposals for grants to support efforts to treat, prevent, and reduce opioid use disorder and the misuse of opioids in the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the financial assistance offered by the OAA is needed to provide opioid mitigation and abatement efforts in Appomattox County; and

WHEREAS, Appoint County has prepared a grant proposal for Fiscal Years 2023 and 2024 that accepts the terms and conditions required by the OAA; and

WHEREAS, the Appomattox County voluntarily agrees to meet the OAA's "Gold Standard" requirements in return for a 25% increase in OAA funding eligibility during these two Fiscal Years; and

WHEREAS, Appoint and 2024 seeks a total of \$18,091.
